## 2007 Firearms Instructor Development Training

The Deputy Sheriffs' Education and Training Board (DSETB) along with the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) is pleased to announce that a Firearms Instructor Development Training will be held on September 17<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, and 19<sup>th</sup>, 2007. The training is to be facilitated by the Penn State Justice and Safety Institute located in State College, Pennsylvania. The course is designed for deputies that serve as firearms instructors.

**Attendees:** Deputy Sheriffs

**Duration:** Three Days (24 Hours)

**Course Dates:** September 17<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, and 19<sup>th</sup>, 2007 – State College

**Description:** This course is designed to provide a familiarization of the firearms training provided to deputies that attend the basic training academy. This training is not a firearms instructor certification course.

**Cost:** Instruction is provided at no cost. Meals and lodging are provided for attendees. In addition, the PCCD will reimburse salary and travel expenses in accordance with the same policies guiding reimbursements submitted during other standard training programs offered by the DSETB and PCCD.

This training is optional and is not mandated by Act 2 of 1984. The training will not count towards the required twenty (20) hours of continuing education. You will be required to bring your issued duty weapon to the training. Note that all ammunition to be utilized during the Firearms Instructor Development Training will be provided. Please be aware that space is limited to 20 deputies per course. More classes may be added depending on the registration demand.

Due to limitations to whom PCCD can reimburse (counties only) and concerns with medical coverage while in training, you must be registered for the course by your sheriff. This training is pass/fail and will be reflected in your official transcripts.
